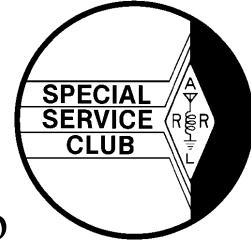




Squaw Island Amateur Radio Club

Good day from your new president. I thought that it would be nice for the membership to know more about their SIARC folks and so I plan to ask each one of us to say a few words about ourselves each month, starting with the officers and board of directors.

I am Tom Sanders, KB2NCI and live in Victor. I have been licensed since 1991 and hold a General class ticket. My elmer was Ernie Brown, K2BWK (sk) and I met him when I moved here from California in 1990. (I tell everyone that I moved here for the weather, but really my wife is from Victor and we moved here after getting married.) I had been a CBer in the 70's and had an interest in ham radio but never pursued it, thinking I could not pass the code (my general came with the 13wpm test, but don't ask me to use it now.) I have been a scanner listener for years and after moving here, found activity on 146.82 to be fun and since Ernie was a family friend, I took a class that the club sponsored in Bloomfield and got my Novice ticket. It was great fun and afterwards I joined SIARC and was at a couple of Field Days (my first at Dale KA2UDH's QTH on Seneca Point Road), before the club went dormant for a few years. When John Park WA2SSJ sent out the notice a few years back about reviving RACES in Ontario County, I jumped on the chance to get active again. My main operating activities are RACES/ARES, public service events, local operating on our repeaters and a little HF work, mostly with special event stations and taking my rigs to play while my scout troop is at camping events and the annual 4H exp. I have accumulated a few rigs: HF rigs of FT747 and FT 857D, vhf FT2400 and dual band FT7800 (2), Icom D-Star 880H, VX5R and VX6R.. I purchased the Argent Tracker and have fun watching the map for activity. We have a motor home (great for traveling with kids!) and hope to someday do some HF from exotic national parks around the US (we have been to Yellowstone and Grand Canyon National Parks and many others along the way). My

wife, Debbie, and I have three children, Kevin 18, Matthew 16 (newly licensed driver---beware!), and Amanda 12.
